- Prepare for Interviews
- Be supported in your career decision making

Workshop 2. Career Management 20th June 2019 (0900-13.15): focusing on developing your CV and preparing for interviews.

Individual Career Consultation 3rd, 4th or 5th September 2019 (1.5 hours)

All participants are required to complete pre-work for this programme. This will be approx. 1.5 hours and include the completion of a Careers Anchors questionnaire and activities in the online Professional Skills for Research Leaders course, available via QOL.
